- 2. Implement the Oxford Common File Layout
- 3. Retain alignment with specified Fedora API
- 4. Release with migration tooling and support



What is the Oxford Common File Layout (OCFL)?







A simple, nonproprietary, specified, openstandards approach to the layout of preservation persistence.

1. Parsability 2. Robustness 3. Versioning **4.** Storage Diversity **5**. Completeness






What are the potential benefits for Samvera?



Simple file and folder hierarchy Readable by both humans and machines Application-independent





Simplified storage architecture (no more ModeShape) Many Members issues have been resolved Early performance tests are promising





New simple search API Built off a database index Not a Solr replacement

Next sprint: November 2-6

Production release: Early 2021
