

- 3. Build a community



















In a Nutshell, Project Hydra...


... has had 11,431 commits made by 96 contributors representing 71,560 lines of code

... has a well established, mature codebase maintained by a very large development team with stable Y-O-Y commits

... took an estimated 18 years of effort (COCOMO model) starting with its first commit in October, 2009 ending with its most recent commit about 2 months ago

In a Nutshell, sufia...

... has had 3,381 commits made by 47 contributors representing 33,702 lines of code

... took an estimated 8 years of effort (COCOMO model) starting with its first commit in November, 2011 ending with its most recent commit about 2 months ago

- May 2015: 24 contributors from 12 institutions, one 2 week sprint
- Summer: 12 people for a sustained 9 week sprint
- Sufia now default starting point for adoption more than 38 implementations in prod or dev in HydraSphere























Hydra-in-a-Box


