- Oxford Common File Layout (OCFL) persistence
- 2. Robust migration tooling and documentation
- 3. Metrics dashboard
- 4. Built-in simple search
- 5. Minimal API changes

A simple, non-proprietary, specified, open-standards approach to the layout of preservation persistence

Fedora Migration Paths and Tools: A Pilot Project

Fedora 3.x to 6.x migrations

Migration Tooling

- migration-utils: Migrate from Fedora 3.x to Fedora 6.0
- fcrepo-migration-validator: Validate your Fedora 3.x -> 6.0 migration
- fcrepo-upgrade-utils: Migrate from Fedora 4.x or 5.x to Fedora 6.0
- <u>fcrepo-import-export</u>: Import and export Fedora 4.x or 5.x repositories (for use in conjunction with fcrepo-upgrade-utils)

Metrics Dashboard

Real-time insights into what's happening in your repository

- Leverages best of breed open source tools
- See performance in time-based graphs
- Helps to troubleshoot bottlenecks









New simple search API
Built off a database index
Not a Solr or Elastic Search replacement


